Is Philippians right for you? 9 diagnostic questions

(answer yes or no)

- 1. Are you struggling with changes in your church? Does it seem different than the church you grew up in?
- 2. Do you struggle to maintain joy and happiness in your life? Do you need a joy-infusion?
- 3. Are you experiencing any conflict with other people in your church?
- 4. Do you struggle with the death of a loved one, on one hand being thankful they are with the Lord, and on the other wishing they were still here?
- 5. Do you ever lose perspective on what is temporary compared to the things that are eternal?
- 6. Do you ever struggle with selfishness and wishing that other people would serve you?
- 7. Do you face any tensions in your job or in society in being in the world but not of the world?
- 8. Are you worried about becoming useless in God's kingdom? Are you concerned that God might be done with you, and has moved on to other people?
- 9. Do you experience feeling connected to others in church? Does it seem like you are lost in it, unable to really know others?
