# APPLICATION

**“God Has Spoken”**

**Main Point:** God has spoken to us through the Son – the ultimate revelation of God to this world.

**God has spoken to us through the Son (1-2a)**

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**Application:** Since God has spoken through the Son, we must pay much closer attention to Him (2:1)

### **Growing Deeper**

1. According to this passage, how does Jesus communicate God to us?
2. This passage provided seven reasons for why Jesus is worthy of our fullest attention. Which of the seven stood out to you? Why?
3. In what way is God's revelation of Himself through Jesus better than the way He revealed Himself in the Old Testament? At the same time, how does Jesus' statement that He came not to abolish the Law and Prophets but to fulfill them (Matt. 5:17) uphold the value we should still have for the Old Testament?
4. If God has spoken ultimately through the Son, is there any need for Him to give us more revelation? Why should we fight against the idea that God still speaks today? How does that undercut the message of Hebrews 1:1-2 and Revelation 22:18-19?
5. How does the fact that God speaks to us fuel our complete confidence in Scripture and serve our knowledge of God and our understanding of His character?

**Family Discipleship:** As a family, consider all the different ways God spoke in the Old Testament. How many people, events, or ways can you think of together? What are some of the most unique? Then, talk as a family about how Jesus shows us God. In what ways does Jesus help us understand what God is like?

**Heart Preparation:** Prepare your heart for worship on April 28th by reading Hebrews 1:4-14.

**Prayer Prompt:** Lord, thank you for being a God who speaks. You have revealed Yourself through Your written Word and through Your Son. Help me to pay much closer attention to Jesus and listen to what He has to say.
