Growing Deeper

- 1. Though we do not currently face slavery like the Israelites in Moses' day, what similarities do you see between their context and ours? In what way are we (and the next generation) growing up in a world where the Christian faith is facing increased opposition?
- 2. What stands out to you about the courageous example of faith by Moses' parents? What causes a Christian to 'go against the grain' and do what is right, even when it is unpopular or runs the risk of greater opposition?
- 3. Does faithfulness in parenting guarantee that our children will walk with the Lord, just like Moses did? Why or why not? As parents, what is the ultimate source of hope and trust for the future of our children?
- 4. What do you think your faith is currently communicating to the next generation? As you consider this responsibility, what changes can you make in the coming days to help communicate a stronger and bolder trust in the Lord?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 08/10 by reading Hebrews 11:23-29 and Exodus 1-15.

Family Discipleship: As a family, watch the short video from

the Biggest Story on Exodus 1-3. It can be found at https://www.thebiggeststory.com/videos/pentateuch/ (Story 13, "God Raises Up a Deliverer"). After watching this video, talk about what it means to fear God more than fearing people. Discuss how our fears control us and shape what we do and how we live. Parents, use this week as an opportunity to have a serious conversation about your parenting and what it currently communicates about your values, priorities, and ultimate trust in this life. What adjustments do you need to make in order to better teach and model courageous faith to your children?

Prayer Prompt: Our loving Father, thank You for the courageous examples of Amram and Jochebed. Help me to be an example of courageous faith for the next generation. May I stand strong in the face of opposition and show others that it is far better to fear You than to fear man. Amen!
