MAIN POINT

Faith does not fear man's approval

power (vv.28-29)

Growing Deeper:

1. This week's lesson covered four different types of fears: cultural opposition, worldly pleasure, man's approval, and death's judgment. Which of these do you find yourself battling the most? Why?
2. Each of the examples of faith from Moses' life contained an element of sight, vision, or perspective (i.e., "looking to the reward"). How does viewing life through the eyes of faith help us maintain faithful endurance in the Christian life?
3. Which demonstration of faith from Moses' life stood out to you most? What hope or encouragement do you find in this particular account?
4. Consider Moses' choice of faith in Hebrews 11:24-26. How did this decision show the surpassing worth of God in his life? How are you actively striving to show the worth of God in your own life?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 08/31 by reading Hebrews 11:30-31, as well as Joshua 2 and 6.

Family Discipleship: As a family, watch the two videos of Moses and the Exodus from the Biggest Story found at <https://www.thebiggeststory.com/videos/> (chapter 13, "God Raises Up a Deliverer" and chapter 14, "Free at Last"). Discuss the many ways that Moses had to trust God throughout his life. Why would this have been tough? Ask your children when they have found it most difficult to trust God. What can they learn from Moses' example? Wrap up the conversation by utilizing the prayer prompt at the end of the video.

Prayer Prompt: Heavenly Father, please forgive me for the way I have feared the things of this world more than You. I confess that I am weak and can often lose eternal perspective. May You graciously grant me the eyes of faith so that I would completely trust You and be fully convinced that Jesus Christ is better than anything else this life can offer. Amen!
