Growing Deeper:

- 1. What do you think of the characters listed in v.32 of chapter 11? Why do you think the author includes them in the hall of faith? What surprises you about their inclusion? What lessons can you learn from their inclusion?
- 2. Read John 15:18-25 and 1 Peter 4:12-19. What do these passages teach us about suffering in the Christian life? Why is it important to proactively arm ourselves with this mindset?
- 3. Why is the health, wealth, and prosperity (Prosperity Gospel) message so dangerous to genuine Christianity? Do you know anyone who has been led astray by this false gospel? If so, how can you use this passage to help combat their misinformed thinking?
- 4. What have you most enjoyed about our study in Hebrews 11? Which character stood out to you? What did you learn or how were you encouraged by their example of steadfast faith?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 09/14 by reading and meditating on Hebrews 12:1-3.

Family Discipleship: As a family, have an honest conversation about both the highs and lows of Christianity. Ask your children what kind of responses they expect to receive from others due to their faith. Help them see that many people throughout history (and the Bible) have been opposed and mistreated for their faith, which means they may also. Use this as an opportunity to pray for strength to stand strong for Jesus, even when it proves to be costly with others.

Prayer Prompt: Most gracious Heavenly Father, thank You for the better salvation You have provided through Jesus Christ. Help me to remain faithful and strong when my faith is opposed by others. May I humbly receive both the joys and hardships of following Jesus in this life. Amen.
