Growing Deeper

1. How certain do you feel about your eternal future? What is the basis for your confidence or lack of certainty?
2. How does the promise of God’s future destruction of this world shape the way you live now? In what way(s) are you living for the things of this world that are perishing and hold no eternal value?
3. Based on your study of Hebrews, why should Christians be the most grateful people on this planet? How can you better display thanksgiving to God in your everyday life?
4. Why is it a good thing that God remains a consuming fire, even for new covenant believers? How does (should) this truth shape the way you live as a Christian?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 11/02 by reading and meditating on Hebrews 13:1-6.

Family Discipleship

Option 1) Teach your kids how listening to a person in authority reflects their value of that person. In other words, to refuse what they say is to refuse them. For example, if you don't listen to mom or dad when they ask you to do something, you express a lack of love or interest for them. Connect this to the truth of Hebrews 2:1-3 and 12:25.

Option 2) Teach your kids the value of the gospel to the rest of this world. For an object lesson, find a valuable object like a coin or special rock. Put it in a sandbox where it can be sifted with the sand and small rocks. Remind your kids that God will one day shake this world, and the only thing that will remain is what matters most. Connect this to the truth of Hebrews 12:26-27.

Prayer Prompt: Most gracious Lord, thank You for the eternal hope You have provided me in the person and work of Jesus. May I forsake the things of this world that have no lasting value, and may I worship You with holy reverence and awe – for You are worthy! Amen.
