#### **Growing Deeper**

- 1. What role does prayer play in our lives and the lives of others? How does God use it as a means to keep His people steadfast in faith?
- 2. Our author exhorts His reads to bear with his word of exhortation. How do you personally need to respond to the instruction you have received in the book of Hebrews? How do you need to hold fast to the truth that Jesus truly is better?
- 3. There are several names and groups of people mentioned at the end of Hebrews. Why does our author share this information? What does it teach us about the importance of community for weary Christians?
- 4. How have you been blessed by this study in the book of Hebrews? What has the past year and a half taught you about the importance of steadfast faith in the Christian life? Which sections of this book have you most enjoyed?

**Heart Preparation**: Our next sermon series in the book of Acts will kick off on January 18, 2026. You can prepare your heart by reading through the book over the next month. Just one chapter per day will get you through the book of Acts by the time we start the new series.

**Family Discipleship**: As a family, reflect on our study in the book of Hebrews. What have you learned? What was most helpful to you? What do you still not understand? What does it mean that Jesus is truly better? Encourage one another with what you have learned. Then, spend time praying for one another, that God would use this truth to produce a faith that remains steadfast when times get hard.

**Prayer Prompt**: Most gracious Father, thank You for this rich study in the book of Hebrews! I praise You for the better salvation that Jesus has provided this world.
