Growing Deeper

1. Why was it important that the disciples had sufficient proof that Jesus was really alive? What difference does that make to our gospel witness as Christians?
2. Do you believe it is the responsibility of every Christian to serve as a witness for Jesus? Why or why not? What other Scriptures support your answer?
3. How is every aspect of your life an opportunity to give witness to the gospel? What about when you are sick? How about when you are suffering? Consider what it means for your life to be built around the mission of Jesus.

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 02/01 by reading Acts 1:12-26

Prayer Prompt: Almighty God, thank You for the undeserved privilege of serving as one of Your gospel witnesses in this world. Help me to reorient all my life around the ongoing mission and work of Jesus. May Your Spirit strengthen and sustain me as I seek to proclaim the good news of the gospel to my unbelieving friends and family. Amen.

Reaching Farther

Family: As a family, talk with your kids about the nature of a witness. Help them see how we ask for people to be witnesses to important events so that we can know the facts and draw the right conclusions. Then explain what it means that we are witnesses for Jesus, even if we did not personally see the things He did or hear the things He taught. Help them understand that our testimony about Jesus is still reliable because the Bible is true and reliable.

Outreach: Begin a regular habit of praying for the three individuals in your sphere of influence who do not know Jesus as Lord and Savior. Additionally, begin looking at all areas of your life and consider how you can serve as a better gospel witness in each area (i.e. marriage, parenting, job, health, school, etc.).
