Growing Deeper

1. What do we learn about the nature of the Christian community from this text? What were their attitudes and habits? How should we seek to imitate these today?
2. When have you found yourself in a significant season of waiting? How have the promises of God sustained and strengthened you? What did this do for your trust in His good purposes for your life?
3. What does a passage like this do for your confidence in the reliability of the Bible? What about the sovereignty of God in all things? How does this provide you with hope in a world where it often feels like evil is winning?
4. How do Christians discover God's will today? Can we know His will? How can we have peace in the decisions we make?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 02/15 by reading and meditating on Acts 2:1-13.

Prayer Prompt: Gracious Lord, I praise you for your sovereign rule and reign over this world. Thank you that the schemes of men can never triumph over your good plans for the church. Help me to trust you in every area of my life, so that I may help your church move toward greater health and stability. Amen.

Reaching Farther

Family: As a family, discuss how the Bible helps us see God's plan to triumph over evil. Help them see that the actions of Judas were not a wrinkle in God's plan but an essential part of it. Use this as an opportunity to teach them how God wins in the end, even if we don't see those victories in the moment.

Community: Before the church was officially "the church," they were a people committed to prayer and holiness. What changes do you need to make to better prepare your heart to be an effective witness for Jesus in this world?
