



Growing Deeper

3. Consider the numerous promises from the Old Testament that were covered in today's sermon. Which one stood out to you most? Why?
4. How does the fulfillment of Old Testament promises impact your relationship with God? What hope and encouragement does do they offer you today?

Heart Preparation: Prepare your heart for worship on 03/29 by reading and meditating on Acts 4:1-22.

Prayer Prompt: Gracious Father, thank you for always keeping your promises. I praise you for the amazing way Jesus is revealed in the Old Testament. Let these promises lead me to a deeper, lasting faith in my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Reaching Farther

Family: Have a conversation with your children about what promises are. Ask them if they have ever made a promise they didn't keep. Then, talk together about whether they think God ever breaks his promises. Discuss why it matters that God always keeps his promises and never breaks them.
